Synopsis of Regular School Attendance Law of South Carolina

1. Duties of Attendance Teachers:

Attendance Teacher contacts parents or guardians of non-attending children to have such children enrolled in the most convenient school located nearest their home by securing proper transfer if necessary and have children continue to attend. Attendance Teacher shall be qualified to handle all problems of non-attendance no matter what the cause.

2. Duties of Other School Authorities:

"Within thirty days after each school term opens, trustees shall have made census of all children of school age in each district between the ages of (7) seven and (16) sixteen inclusive who had not enrolled in such school district or in some other district during said thirty day enrollment period, and the names, ages, places of residence, and names of parents or guardians of such children of school age not enrolled shall be forthwith filed with the County Superintendent of Education, who shall thereupon consolidate all of said names of children in alphabetical order into one list and certify the same to the Attendance Teacher of the County." Teachers are required to report children absent five (5) days running and failure to do this requires teacher to forfeit five (\$5.00) dollars, each month.

3. Duties of Parents or Guardians and Pupils:

All children are required to attend school during the entire term school is in session. In order that illiteracy may be reduced in our state, earnest and honest co-operation is confidently expected. In cases where parents are financially unable to furnish books these cases are to be referred to the trustees and the County Supt. of Education. Parents or guardians willfully neglecting or refusing to make children attend school are subject to a fine not to exceed twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for each day absent or imprisonment not in excess of ten (10) days.

4. General Provisions of the Law:

Where children are lacking clothes or books sufficient to attend school, the co-operation of civic and social organizations shall be requested. "The County Supt. of Education and the District Board of Trustees shall constitute a Board of Inquiry in all cases, but any party aggrieved by their finding and ruling may appeal the same to the Court of Common Pleas of the County for review."

Certificates

A first-grade academic certificate shall be issued to any A. B. or B. S. graduate of an accredited college of this state upon presentation of proper records and recommendations. This certificate is valid for a term of three years and may be renewed. A first-grade professional academic certificate shall be issued upon an A. B. or B. S. diploma from an accredited college of this state with a transcript showing eighteen semester hours in Education, is valid for a term of five years, and may be renewed.

A first-grade general elementary certificate shall be issued to any student of an accredited college submitting a full and satisfactory transcript of not less than two full years of standard and acceptable work, together with a recommendation from the head of the college where such work was done plus a clear and explicit statement from the applicant setting forth in detail his or her reasons for leaving college, as well as his or her reasons for seeking a teacher's license. Such certificate shall be valid for three years and may be renewed.

A second-grade general elementary certificate shall be issued on the basis of both a state high school diploma and a satisfactory transcript of one full year's work from an accredited college of this state. This transcript shall show that the applicant has successfully completed not less than thirty semester hours of standard college work leading to the A. B.

or B. S. degree and it must contain a recommendation from the head of the college where the work was done plus a clear and explicit statement from the applicant setting forth in detail his or her reasons for seeking a teacher's license. Such certificate shall be valid for two years and may be renewed.

Whenever the Board of Trustees of a school district reports to the County Board of Education that it has failed, after exhaustive efforts, to secure teachers who hold standard certificates, the State Board of Education will receive applications for certificates from applicants who have had successful summer school credits, and who are approved and recommended in writing by both a majority of the members of the Board of Trustees and the County Board of Education of the county. If the State Board of Education deems it expedient, it may grant such applicants non-standard certificates, valid for one scholastic year. The grade of such non-standard certificates shall be fixed by the State Board, and said non-standard certificates shall not be transferable nor renewable.

Miscellaneous Legal Information

No child under 14 years of age shall be employed in any factory, workshop, or mercantile establishment, or any place during school hours in a school district, unless the person employing such child shall procure a certificate from the Superintendent or teacher stating that the child attended school for the period required by law or is excused from attendance provided by law.

VACCINATION

Any Board of Education, School Trustee, or any other body having control of any of the schools may, on account of the prevalence of any contagious or infectious diseases, or to prevent the spread of any such disease, prohibit the attendance of any teacher or scholar in any school under their control, and may specify that such teacher or scholar shall remain absent, or they shall require a satisfactory certificate from one or more reputable practicing physicians that such attendance is no longer attended with risk to others attending school, and may also prohibit the entrance into or attendance at any school of all unvaccinated persons who have not had the smallpox.

LOYALTY TO CONSTITUTION

Persons attending the public schools must show loyalty to the Constitution of the United States, and

before receiving a diploma must pass an examination on the provisions and principles of the United States Constitution, and shall also satisfy the examining power or his or her loyalty thereto. Failure to comply to this is a cause for removal of any public school superintendent, principal, or teacher, or other officer connected with the school.

TRANSFERS

When it shall so happen that persons are so situated as to be better accommodated at the school of an adjoining school district, the Board of Trustees of the school district in which such persons reside may transfer such persons and the school district in which such school is located shall receive such persons into the school as though they resided within the district; Provided, That children shall not be transferred from one school district to another without the consent of the Board of Trustees of the school district to which the transfer is made. Provided further, that the trustees of any school district who knowingly permit the enrollment of pupils who have not been transferred without the consent of the trustees of the district wherein such pupils reside, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall pay a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, or be imprisoned not more than 30 days. Provided further, that when it shall appear that the trustees of any district are unreasonably or capriciously withholding their consent to a transfer then the County Board may order such transfer made.

DUTIES OF TRUSTEES

1. To Provide Schoolhouses—To provide suitable schoolhouses in their districts, and to make the same comfortable.
2. To Employ and Discharge Teachers—To fix salaries. To discharge the teachers when good and sufficient reasons for so doing present themselves.
3. Qualifications of Teachers—No general or special trustee shall employ any teacher who has not a certificate to teach in the free public schools of the state.
4. To Suspend or Dismiss Pupils—When the best interest of the schools make it necessary, the trustees may act accordingly.
5. To Call Meetings for Consultation .
6. To Control School Property.
7. To Visit Schools .
8. To Cause an Annual Physical Examination to be made of the school pupils and to pay out of the incidental funds not above 10c for each pupil's examination.

RE-EMPLOYMENT OF TEACHERS

By authority of Act 176, Acts of the General Assembly of South Carolina, 1936, it is provided that in the event the trustees of any school district in this state shall fail to notify any teacher holding valid teacher's certificate in their respective district in writing on or before June 1; or in case on such date the school has not completed its state aid term and the number of teachers for which it qualifies is uncertain, then on or before the tenth day after the close of the State Aid term, of each year to the effect that such teacher will not be re-employed for the next ensuing year, such failure to so notify such teacher shall be an act of re-employment and the teacher may hold the trustees to this contract. Provided that this shall not be considered re-employment of such teacher unless such teacher shall, on or before the fourteenth day after the expiration of the time above provided for the giving of such notice by the trustees, notify the trustees of the school, or the chairman of such Board of Trustees of his or her written acceptance of such re-employment.

The same Act provided that no contract shall be entered into with a teacher before April 15 of each year.

Trustee Election

SECTION 1. School trustees, Oconee county—number—elect—term. That the Board of Trustees of each of the school districts in Oconee county shall consist of three members, who shall be qualified electors of their respective districts and who, except as is herein otherwise provided, shall be elected by the qualified voters of their respective school districts. That the term of office of said trustee shall be for a period of three years and until their respective successors shall have been selected and qualified.

SEC. 2. Election—time—designation of terms. That on the last day of June, 1941, and on the last day in June of every year thereafter, there shall be an election held in the various school districts in said county for the purpose of electing successors to the trustees whose terms of office expire during the year in which such elections are held, and to fill the vacancy that may exist in the board of trustees of the respective school districts. That at such election the person receiving the highest number of votes in the respective districts shall be declared elected; and, in case in any district there be two offices to be filled by such election, the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected to fill the longer term and the person receiving the second

highest number of votes shall be declared elected to fill the other term; and, should there be all three offices to be filled, the person receiving the third highest vote shall be declared elected to fill the shortest term to be filled.

School Districts—Consolidation

The County Board of Education shall divide their counties into convenient school districts, as compact in form as practicable, having regard to natural boundaries, and not to exceed forty-nine nor be less than nine square miles in area, and shall alter the lines thereof, and create additional school districts from time to time as the interests of the schools may, in their judgment, demand. Provided, That no new school district shall be created by the said County Board of Education except upon the petition of at least one-third of the qualified electors embraced within the limits of such proposed school district. Provided, further, That no school district shall be consolidated except upon petition of at least one-third of the qualified voters of the school districts proposed to be consolidated. Provided, further, Whenever territory embraced in two or more counties is proposed to be formed into one school district, the same may be formed by the joint action of the Board of Education of the respective counties as herein provided for the formation of school districts in a county. Provided, That in cities of ten thousand inhabitants and over, this limitation of area shall not apply. Provided, further, That when any school district laid out under this section shall embrace cities or towns already organized into special school districts, in which graded school buildings have been erected by the issue of bonds, or by special taxation, or by donation, all the territory included in said school district shall bear its just proportion of any tax that may be levied to liquidate such bonds or support the public schools therein.
